STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of the Madawaska Training School.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum
2 of three thousand dollars for the Madawaska Training
3 School for repairs upon the training school buildings and
4 school equipments, fifteen hundred dollars being for the year
5 nineteen hundred and five, and fifteen hundred dollars for
6 the year nineteen hundred and six and that the same be
7 expended under the direction of the trustees.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The dormitory is now heated by direct heat from furnaces in cellar. These are insufficient for heating the entire building, and a large number of stoves have to be used in the rooms occupied by the students, making the cost of heating more expensive, while the ventilation is poor, and danger from fire is considerable.

The windmill used in pumping the water for the buildings is worn out, and a motor is required to take its place. By using a motor water can be pumped when needed, while with a windmill this cannot always be done.

The floors in the building used for recitations are badly worn and splintered. These need to be replaced. The desks now used have been in the building many years and are badly worn, and not what are needed in the rooms. New ones should be provided.
