STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of marking the grave of the late Governor
Hunton.

Resolved, That the sum of five hundred dollars be and is
2 hereby appropriated for the purpose of improving the burial
3 lot and erecting a suitable monument or other tablet to mark
4 the last resting place of Governor Jonathan G. Hunton, whose
5 remains are interred in the village cemetery at Readfield, the
6 same to be expended by some person appointed by and under
7 the direction of the governor and council.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Governor Hunton died in destitute circumstances and the tablet marking his grave is of the cheapest granite, while the lot is about in the condition which nature left it.

There are none but distant relatives and even those are in moderate circumstances and could not therefore bear the expense of adequately renovating the lot and suitably marking the resting place of their distinguished ancestor. The cemetery association will perpetually care for the lot after it is put in condition commensurate with the dignity of the deceased and the duty of the State in such cases.
