STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 26 of chapter 3 of the Revised
Statutes in relation to printing of the different departments.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section 26 of chapter 3 of the Revised Statutes
2 is hereby amended by adding after the word "necessary" in
3 the fourth line and before the word "except" in the fifth line
4 of said section the following words 'such order for printing
5 to be subject to the approval of the governor and council,' so
6 that said section as amended shall read as follows:

'Section 26. Each department, bureau and institution may
8 have printed at the expense of the State, bulletins and circu-
9 lar letters of inquiry and information, at such times and in
10 such numbers as the officer in charge thereof may consider

11 necessary, such order for printing to be subject to the
12 approval of the governor and council.

Except as hereinbefore provided, no reports, catalogues or
14 compilations shall be printed, stitched or bound by any
15 department, bureau, commission or institution of the State,
16 at the expense of the State, unless by virtue of special legis-
17 lative provision therefor.'
