STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend section 13 of chapter 128 of the Revised Statutes, relating to malicious mischief.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 13 of chapter 128 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 amended by adding to said section after the word "owner" in 3 the third line the words 'in writing,' and also by striking out 4 of said section all after the word "officers" in the fifth line of 5 said section and inserting in place thereof the words 'in writ-6 ing shall be punished for each offence by a fine of not less 7 than five dollars nor more than twenty dollars together with 8 costs,' so that said section 13, as amended, shall read as 9 follows:

'Section 13. Whoever advertises his wares or occupation 11 by painting notices of the same on, or affixing them to fences 12 or other private property, or to rocks or other natural objects,
13 without the consent of the owner in writing, or if in the
14 highway or any other public place, without the consent of
15 the municipal officers in writing, shall be punished for each
16 offence by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than
17 twenty dollars together with costs.'
