Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated out of
2 any money in the State treasury the sum of three hundred
3 eighty-two dollars to be paid Joseph Archambault of Fort
4 Kent for medicines and medical attendance in smallpox and
5 diphtheria cases in New Canada, Wallagrass, Eagle Lake,
6 Winterville, St. John and St. Francis plantations and on the
7 headwaters of the Allagash river in the years 1903 and 1904.
