IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to establish a law uniform with other states relative to Insurance Policies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. No policy of insurance shall be rendered invalid

- 2 by reason of any statement, representation or warranty made
- 3 by the insured unless the same shall be material to the risk
- 4 or made with intent to defraud.
 - Sect. 2. This act shall apply to all certificates of fraternal
- 2 and mutual benefit as well as to all other forms of insurance.
- Sect. 3. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith 2 are hereby repealed.

The Committee on Merchantile Affairs and Insurance to which was referred the bill entitled "An Act to establish a law uniform with other states relative to insurance policies," have had the same under consideration, and ask leave to report the same in a new draft, under the title of "An Act to establish a law uniform with other states relative to insurance policies" and that it ought to pass.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to establish a law uniform with other states relative to Insurance Policies.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. No policy of insurance shall be rendered invalid
- 2 by reason of any statement, representation or warranty made
- 3 by the insured unless the same shall be material to the risk
- 4 or made with intent to defraud.
- Sect. 2. No policy of insurance shall contain any condition,
- 2 provision or agreement which shall, directly or indirectly,
- 3 deprive the insured or the beneficiary of the right of trial by
- 4 jury on any question of facts arising under said policy and
- 5 all such conditions, provisions or agreement shall be void.
- Sect. 3. This act shall apply to certificates of fraternal and 2 mutual benefit as well as to all other forms of insurance.
- Sect. 4. All acts and parts of acts inconsistent herewith 2 are hereby repealed.

The Committee on Merchantile Affairs and Insurance to which was referred the bill entitled "An Act to establish a law uniform with other states relative to insurance policies," have had the same under consideration and ask leave to report that the same ought to pass.
