STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in aid of navigation on Moosehead Lake.

Resolved, That the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars 2 is hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys in Moose-3 head lake and the erection of lights in Moosehead lake and 4 the maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred 5 and five, and the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars is 6 hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys in Moosehead 7 lake and the erection of lights in Moosehead lake and the 8 maintenance of the same for the year nineteen hundred and Said buoys and lights shall be placed at such points in 9 six. 10 Moosehead lake as will best serve the needs of navigation All said moneys shall be expended under the direc-11 thereon. 12 tion of the State steamboat inspectors; any part of the money 13 hereby appropriated for the placing of buoys and mainten-14 ance of lights which shall be unexpended at the end of the 15 year nineteen hundred and six shall revert back to the State.
