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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

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AN ACT to amend sections 24 and 25 of chapter 3 of the  
Revised Statutes relating to State printing.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. That sections 24 and 25 of chapter 3 of the  
2 Revised Statutes be and are hereby amended so as to read  
3 as follows:

'Sect. 24. The number of copies of the following named  
5 reports to be printed hereafter at the expense of the State  
6 shall be determined by the governor and council but shall  
7 not exceed the following numbers: The report of the com-  
8 missioner of agriculture, six thousand copies annually; the  
9 report of the bank examiner, two thousand copies; the report  
10 of the commissioner of the bureau of labor and industrial

11 statistics, four thousand copies ; the report of the officers and  
12 trustees of the State School for Boys, fifteen hundred copies  
13 annually ; the report of the Industrial School for Girls, fifteen  
14 hundred copies annually ; the report of the officers and trus-  
15 tees of the State prison, fifteen hundred copies annually ; the  
16 report of the commissioners on the contagious diseases of  
17 animals, two thousand five hundred copies annually ; the  
18 report of the registrar of vital statistics, two thousand copies  
19 annually ; the report of the insurance commissioner, two  
20 thousand five hundred copies annually ; the report of the  
21 railroad commissioners, two thousand copies annually ; the  
22 report of the State superintendent of public schools, four  
23 thousand copies on each legislative year, and three thousand  
24 five hundred copies on the alternate year ; the report of the  
25 treasurer of the State, three thousand copies on each legis-  
26 lative year, and twenty-five hundred copies on the alternate  
27 year ; the report of the trustees and officers of the insane hos-  
28 pitals, two thousand copies on each legislative year, and  
29 fifteen hundred copies on the alternate year ; the report of the  
30 board of State assessors, four thousand copies on each legis-  
31 lative year, and three thousand copies on the alternate year ;  
32 the report of the attorney general, one thousand copies bien-  
33 nially ; the report of the land agent and forest commissioner,  
34 three thousand copies biennially ; the report of the State  
35 board of health, forty-five hundred copies biennially ; the  
36 report of the adjutant general, twelve hundred copies annu-  
37 ally ; the report of the librarian of the Maine State library,  
38 one thousand copies biennially ; the report of the Bath Mili-  
39 tary and Naval Orphan Asylum, one thousand copies bien-

40 nially. Of the above named reports seventy-five copies may  
41 be retained by the binder for public documents, and at least  
42 six hundred and seventy-five copies shall be delivered to the  
43 State librarian, by the binder, for exchange, library use and  
44 general distribution, and the balance of the number of each  
45 report shall be delivered to the head of the department or  
46 institution where it originated and was prepared for publi-  
47 cation.'

'Sect. 25. The reports, catalogues and compilations of all  
49 State departments, bureaus, commissions and institutions,  
50 other than as enumerated in the preceding section, may be  
51 printed and bound, but the number and the styles in which  
52 the same shall be so printed and bound, at the expense of the  
53 State, shall be determined from time to time by the governor  
54 and council, who shall also fix the number of the same which  
55 shall be delivered from the bindery or printing office to the  
56 librarian of the State library.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
