STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the compensation of judges of probate.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

- Section 1. The judges of probate are entitled to receive
- 2 annual salaries from the treasurers of their counties in quar-
 - 3 terly payments on the first days of January, April, July and
 - 4 October as follows:
 - 5 Androscoggin, one thousand dollars.
 - 6 Aroostook, one thousand dollars.
 - 7 Cumberland, two thousand five hundred dollars.
 - 8 Franklin, four hundred dollars.
 - 9 Hancock, eleven hundred dollars.
 - 10 Kennebec, fifteen hundred dollars.
 - 11 Knox, five hundred dollars.
 - 12 Lincoln, four hundred dollars.

- 13 Oxford, seven hundred and fifty dollars.
- 14 Penobscot, sixteen hundred dollars.
- 15 Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.
- 16 Sagadahoc, seven hundred dollars.
- 17 Somerset, seven hundred dollars.
- 18 Waldo, seven hundred dollars.
- 19 Washington, eight hundred dollars.
- 20 York, one thousand dollars; and the fees to which they are
- 21 entitled by law shall be taxed and collected, and paid over
- 22 by the registers of probate to the county treasurers for the
- 23 use of their counties.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of July,
2 one thousand nine hundred and five.
