STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to the compensation of registers of deeds.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The registers of deeds in the several counties
2 shall receive annual salaries from the treasurers of the coun-
3 ties in quarterly payments on the first days of January, April,
4 July and October, as follows:

5 Androscoggin, twelve hundred dollars, with four hundred
6 dollars additional for clerk hire.

7 Aroostook, northern registry, one thousand dollars; southern
8 registry, fifteen hundred dollars, with eleven hundred dol-
9 lars additional for clerk hire.

10 Cumberland, two thousand five hundred dollars, with eighteen
11 hundred dollars additional for clerk hire.

12 Franklin, one thousand dollars, with two hundred dollars
13 additional for clerk hire.

- 14 Hancock, thirteen hundred dollars, with nine hundred dollars
15 additional for clerk hire.
- 16 Kennebec, fifteen hundred dollars, with one thousand dollars
17 additional for clerk hire.
- 18 Knox, one thousand dollars, with three hundred dollars addi-
19 tional for clerk hire.
- 20 Lincoln, one thousand dollars, with one hundred dollars addi-
21 tional for clerk hire.
- 22 Oxford, eastern registry, twelve hundred dollars, with four
23 hundred dollars additional for clerk hire; western registry,
24 four hundred and fifty dollars.
- 25 Penobscot, seventeen hundred dollars, with one thousand dol-
26 lars additional for clerk hire.
- 27 Piscataquis, eight hundred dollars, with three hundred dol-
28 lars additional for clerk hire.
- 29 Sagadahoc, one thousand dollars, with two hundred and fifty
30 dollars additional for clerk hire.
- 31 Somerset, fifteen hundred dollars, with three hundred dollars
32 additional for clerk hire.
- 33 Waldo, one thousand dollars, with three hundred dollars
34 additional for clerk hire.
- 35 Washington, twelve hundred dollars, with three hundred dol-
36 lars additional for clerk hire.
- 37 York, fifteen hundred dollars, with twelve hundred dollars
38 additional for clerk hire.

The sums above mentioned shall be in full compensation for
40 the performance of all official duties and in lieu of all fees.
41 They shall account quarterly under oath to the county treas-
42 urers for all fees received by them or payable to them by
43 virtue of the office, specifying the items, and shall pay the
44 whole amount of the same to the treasurers of their respective
45 counties quarterly on the first days of January, April, July
46 and October of each year. On the first day of January of
47 each year the registers receiving the sums above specified for

48 clerk hire shall make under oath to the county treasurers of
49 their respective counties a statement specifying the amounts
50 paid by them for that purpose and to whom paid, during the
51 year next preceding, and shall pay said treasurers any unex-
52 pended balance of said sums in their hands.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect on the first day of July,
2 one thousand nine hundred and five.
