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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

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AN ACT relating to the compensation of county attorneys.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The county attorneys are entitled to receive  
2 annual salaries from the treasurer of State in quarterly pay-  
3 ments on the first days of January, April, July and October,  
4 as follows: For the counties of  
5 Androscoggin, one thousand dollars.  
6 Aroostook, one thousand dollars.  
7 Cumberland, fifteen hundred dollars.  
8 Frankin, four hundred dollars.  
9 Hancock, seven hundred and fifty dollars.  
10 Kennebec, one thousand dollars.  
11 Knox, six hundred dollars.

- 12 Lincoln, four hundred dollars.
- 13 Oxford, six hundred dollars.
- 14 Penobscot, one thousand dollars.
- 15 Piscataquis, five hundred dollars.
- 16 Sagadahoc, five hundred dollars.
- 17 Somerset, seven hundred dollars.
- 18 Waldo, five hundred dollars.
- 19 Washington, eight hundred dollars.
- 20 York, one thousand dollars; and no other fees, costs or
- 21 emoluments shall be allowed them, unless otherwise
- 22 expressly provided. The assistant county attorney for the
- 23 county of Cumberland, seven hundred dollars. He shall
- 24 hold his office during the term of the county attorney by
- 25 whom he is appointed, subject to removal at any time by the
- 26 justice of the superior court for said county.

Sect. 2. So much of this act as reduces the salary of any  
2 county attorney shall not take effect while the present  
3 incumbent continues to hold office; and except as aforesaid  
4 said act shall take effect on the first day of July, one thou-  
5 sand nine hundred and five.
