STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT recognizing Pepperell Manufacturing Company as a corporation legally organized, and granting to it additional powers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Pepperell Manufacturing Company, a corporation organized under the general laws of Maine, located at Biddeford in said State, is hereby authorized to make and generate electricity at its various water privileges upon Saco river for its own use for lighting, heating, manufacturing or mechanical purposes at said privileges, and to transmit the same to its plant and mills in Biddeford for its own use there

8 for lighting, heating, manufacturing or mechanical purposes
9 in its own business.

Sect. 2. Said corporation, for the purposes aforesaid, is
2 hereby authorized to set poles and to construct, lay, maintain
3 and operate lines of wires or other material in, through,
4 under, over and along any and all streets and ways of the
5 towns of Buxton, Hollis, Dayton, Saco and Biddeford, sub-
6 ject, however, to the permission of the municipal officers
7 thereof and under such reasonable restrictions as they may
8 impose, and subject to the general laws of the State regulat-
9 ing the building and maintaining of conduits and the erection
10 of poles and wires for electrical purposes.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
