STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT to amend the city charter and city ordinances of the city of Gardiner in relation to the election of the city marshal and the street commissioner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. The city marshal of the city of Gardiner, and

- 2 the street commissioner of the city of Gardiner, or either of
- 3 them as may be determined under the provisions of the act,
- 4 shall annually be elected in the same manner and upon the
- 5 same day that the mayor of said city of Gardiner is elected.
 - Sect. 2. This act shall refer solely to the method of the
- 2 election of the two officers, city marshal and street commis-
- 3 sioner of the said city of Gardiner, and shall in no wise affect

4 their duties or powers as now established by the charter and 5 ordinances of said city of Gardiner.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved by a 2 majority vote of the legal voters voting at an election held 3 under the provisions of this act, and a special election shall 4 be duly called and held for this purpose within thirty days 5 after the municipal officers have been petitioned by one hun-6 dred qualified voters of the city of Gardiner to call an election 7 therefor. Such election shall be called, advertised and con-8 ducted according to the law relating to municipal elections; 9 provided, however, that the board of registration shall not 10 be required to prepare, or the city clerk to post a new list of II voters for this purpose. Said board shall be in session the 12 two secular days next preceding said election, the first day 13 thereof to be devoted to the regulation of the voters, and the 14 last day to enable the board to verify the corrections of said 15 lists, and to complete and close up its records of said 16 sessions.

The city clerk shall reduce the subject matter of this act 18 to the following questions:

"Shall the street commissioner and the city marshal of the 20 city of Gardiner be elected by a direct vote of the voters of 21 the city of Gardiner?"

And the voters shall indicate by a cross placed against the 23 words of each question,—"Yes" or "No," their opinion of 24 the same. The result shall be declared by the mayor and 25 aldermen, and due certificate thereof filed by the city clerk 26 with the secretary of State. This act shall take effect when

27 approved by the governor, so as necessary to empower the28 calling and holding of such election.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
