## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

---

AN ACT to amend chapter one hundred and thirty-five of the  
Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five relating to  
Bath municipal court.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Section ten of chapter one hundred and thirty-  
2 five of the Public Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-five,  
3 is hereby amended so as to read as follows:

'Section 10. Said court may adjourn from time to time and  
5 shall be held at such place as shall be provided by the city of  
6 Bath and shall be considered in constant session for the trial  
7 of criminal offenses; said court shall be in session each Mon-  
8 day at ten o'clock in the forenoon for the entry and trial of

9 civil actions. Every defendant and every person summoned  
10 as trustee shall have twenty-four hours in which to enter his  
11 appearance. If no appearance is entered within said twenty-  
12 four hours judgment may be entered, but no execution shall  
13 issue until twenty-four hours thereafter.'

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
