STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of Ida Yeaton, widow of John Yeaton late
of the Third Maine Battery.

Resolved, That there be paid to Mrs. Ida Yeaton a State
2 pension of eight dollars per month from January first, nine-
3 teen hundred and five, until such time as she shall receive a
4 United States pension, or until she shall again marry.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Ida Yeaton, widow of John Yeaton, married said Yeaton about eighteen hundred and ninety-two, by whom she has three children under ten years of age. Said Yeaton was pensioned at thirty dollars per month for disease of eyes, and having died from other disease his widow has no title under the general law. This widow has no property and no means of support except her own labor.
