STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to a winter speedway on the Kennebec river, at Gardiner.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Frank E. Boston, Charles S. Whitney, Fred E. 2 Potter, F. W. Rafter, G. E. Brown, G. H. Harrington, B. E. 3 Lamb, and their associates, successors or assigns, are hereby 4 incorporated under the name of the Gardiner and Randolph 5 Driving Club, and are hereby authorized to mark out and 6 appropriate yearly a winter speedway for horses and their 7 drivers on the Kennebec river at Gardiner, at a distance not 8 exceeding one (I) mile southerly from the Gardiner and 9 Randolph bridge; and to charge a reasonable sum to each 10 person who may desire to use the same.

SENATE—No. 226.

Said course shall be located so as not to abridge or impede 12 a reasonable opportunity for public travel without the limits 13 thereof, and not to interfere with the use of the ice in said 14 river for commercial purposes.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
