IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND FIVE.

AN ACT relating to Milo Electric Light & Power Company,  
ratifying and confirming its proceedings.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The organization of the Milo Electric Light &  
2 Power Company, under the general laws of the State, as  
3 recorded in the records of corporations in the office of the  
4 secretary of State, volume twenty-eight, page five hundred  
5 and seventy-nine, is hereby confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 2. The existing permit from the municipal officers  
2 of the town of Milo to the Milo Electric Light & Power  
3 Company, dated April third, nineteen hundred and two,

4 granting rights to the company to construct and maintain a  
5 system of wires and poles for electric lighting purposes  
6 along the highways and in the public roads in the town of  
7 Milo and all proceedings relating to said permit are hereby  
8 ratified, confirmed and made valid.

Sect. 3. The existing contract for street lighting executed  
2 in the year nineteen hundred and four, between said corpo-  
3 ration and the inhabitants of the town of Milo is hereby  
4 ratified, confirmed and made valid; and said town of Milo  
5 is hereby authorized to raise such sums of money from time  
6 to time, as may be necessary for the purposes thereof.

Sect. 4. This act shall take effect when approved.
