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## STATE OF MAINE.

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RESOLVE in favor of Moses Moon, a Civil War Veteran.

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*Resolved,* That there be paid to Moses Moon a State pension of six dollars per month from January first, nineteen hundred and five, until such time as he shall receive an increase in his United States pension.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Moses Moon is a resident of Surry. He served in the Second Infantry, Maine Volunteers, and in the 20th Infantry, Maine Volunteers, and was subsequently transferred to the United States Navy from which he was honorably discharged by reason of the close of the war.

Said Moon receives twelve dollars per month from the United States government.

I am personally acquainted with Mr. Moon and the pension which he receives is inadequate for his support as he is unable to do any work. He is seventy-six years of age and has a wife past seventy years of age, and has no other means of support than the pension which he now draws. He was a brave soldier and promptly responded to the call of his country, and I feel it would be justice to him to aid him in this his time of need. His health is very poor and he needs medical attendance and will have to be helped by the town if denied State aid.
