RESOLVE in favor of the Healy Asylum.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated to the

- 2 Healy Asylum, located at Lewiston, the sum of two thou-
- 3 sand dollars for the year 1907, and the sum of two thousand
- 4 dollars for the year 1908, both said sum for maintenance.
- 5 Be it further

Resolved, That the further sum of one thousand dollars be

- 7 and hereby is appropriated for the use of said Healy Asylum
- 8 for the year 1907, and one thousand dollars for the year
- 9 1908, both said sums for repairs.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Healy Asylum was founded in Lewiston in eighteen ninetythree for the purpose of providing a home for little boys who have been left orphans or have been forsaken by their parents.

Since its establishment, sixteen hundred seventy-two, friendless boys have been admitted to this institution at ages ranging from three to fourteen years. There is no discrimination in regard to race or creed. The children come from all parts of the state, thirty-nine cities and towns being represented at present.

During the past year two hundred and seventy-six boys have been admitted. The largest number on any given day was one hundred and eighty-five; the average number resident during the past year was one hundred and seventy-five.

The institution is supported by money received for the board of children and the state appropriation. The expenditures for the past year were fifteen thousand four hundred and eighty-eight dollars and fifty-seven cents; the receipts were ten thousand eight hundred and seventy-eight dollars and twenty cents, leaving a debt of four thousand six hundred and ten dollars and thirty-seven cents on current expenses.
