## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter 163, Public Laws of 1905, relating to the exemption of soldiers and sailors from poll tax.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. An Act to amend chapter 163, Public Laws of

2 the State of Maine, passed by the Seventy-second Legis-3 lature, A. D. 1905, relating to exempting soldiers and sailors

4 of the Civil War from poll tax, by striking out the words in

5 the sixth, seventh and eighth lines, "who is not assessed

6 for taxes in his own town for more than five hundred dol-

7 lars," so that said section as amended, shall read as follows:

'Section I. Every soldier or sailor who served in the 9 arm or navy of the United States in the war of eighteen 10 hundred and sixty-one and five, and who has an honorable

- 11 discharge from such service, resident within the State of 12 Maine, is hereby forever exempt from the assessment of
- 13 and payment of a poll tax within any city, town or plantation 14 in this State.'
  - Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved by the 2 governor.
