STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of the Bar Harbor Medical and Surgical
Hospital located at Bar Harbor, Maine.

Resolved: That there be and hereby is appropriated the
2 sum of two thousand dollars to be paid to the Bar Harbor
3 Medical and Surgical Hospital, toward the running expenses
4 of said institution for the year nineteen hundred and seven
5 and two thousand dollars toward the running expenses of said
6 institution for the year nineteen hundred and eight.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

The Bar Harbor Medical and Surgical Hospital owns land which cost over nine thousand dollars, on which buildings have been erected costing over twenty-six thousand dollars, equipped with furniture, laboratory and surgical apparatus costing almost four thousand dollars, making a total of thirty-nine thousand dollars. All of this amount has been paid for by subscriptions largely made by the summer people.

Last year the expenses of running the hospital were as follows:

The income from the hospital was as follows:

Received from ward patients,	\$1054 50

Leaving an amount to be provided, outside of the ordinary income of fifty-four hundred and thirty-two dollars and forty cents.

This amount was supplied by an entertainment gotten up by the summer people, by donations from various sources and by the amount received from the state of two thousand dollars.

The hospital provides aid for people from all over the state who from time to time sojourn at Bar Harbor and those people who are interested in it and donate liberally towards its support feel that the two thousand dollars is a modest sum to ask for from the state to assist in making up the deficit between ordinary expenses as stated above and the ordinary income from patients.
