STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT additional to Chapter 127 of the Revised Statutes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Whoever enters into an agreement to labor for 2 another in any lumbering operation or in driving logs and 3 in consideration thereof receives any advance of goods, 4 money, or transportation, and unreasonably and with intent 5 to defraud fails to enter into said employment as agreed, 6 and labor for a sufficient length of time to reimburse his 7 employer for said advances and expenses of transportation, 8 shall be punished by fine of not exceeding ten dollars or 9 by imprisonment not exceeding thirty days.

Sect. 2. Judges of municipal courts and trial justices shall 2 have jurisdiction of the offence described in this act.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
