IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Indian pond, so-called, in town-
ship 1, Range 8, W. B. K. P., Franklin County, known as
“Lowelltown.”

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. Indian pond, so-called, in Township 1, Range 8,
2 W. B. K. P., Franklin County, known as “Lowelltown,” is
3 hereby closed to all fishing of any kind for any kind of fish
4 until July 1st, A. D., 1908.

Sect. 2. It shall be lawful to fish in said pond after July
2 first, A. D. 1908, during July and August of each year, in
3 the manner provided in the general laws of the state, except
4 on Sunday of each week it shall be unlawful to fish for, take,
5 catch or kill any fish in said pond.

Sect. 3. No trout less than 9 inches in length and no land-locked salmon less than 12 inches in length taken in said pond shall be killed or carried away at any time, and not more than eight pounds of fish in all shall be caught in said pond in any one day by any one person.

Sect. 4. Whoever shall violate any of the provisions of this act shall be punished by a fine of ten dollars for each offense and one dollar additional for each and every fish taken, or caught in violation hereof.

Sect. 5. Provided, further, that this Act shall not take effect until the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game, without expense to the state, shall have caused notices to be posted in conspicuous places at or near said pond, setting forth in substance the provisions of this Act.
