HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate the use of certain roads in the town of
Blue Hill.

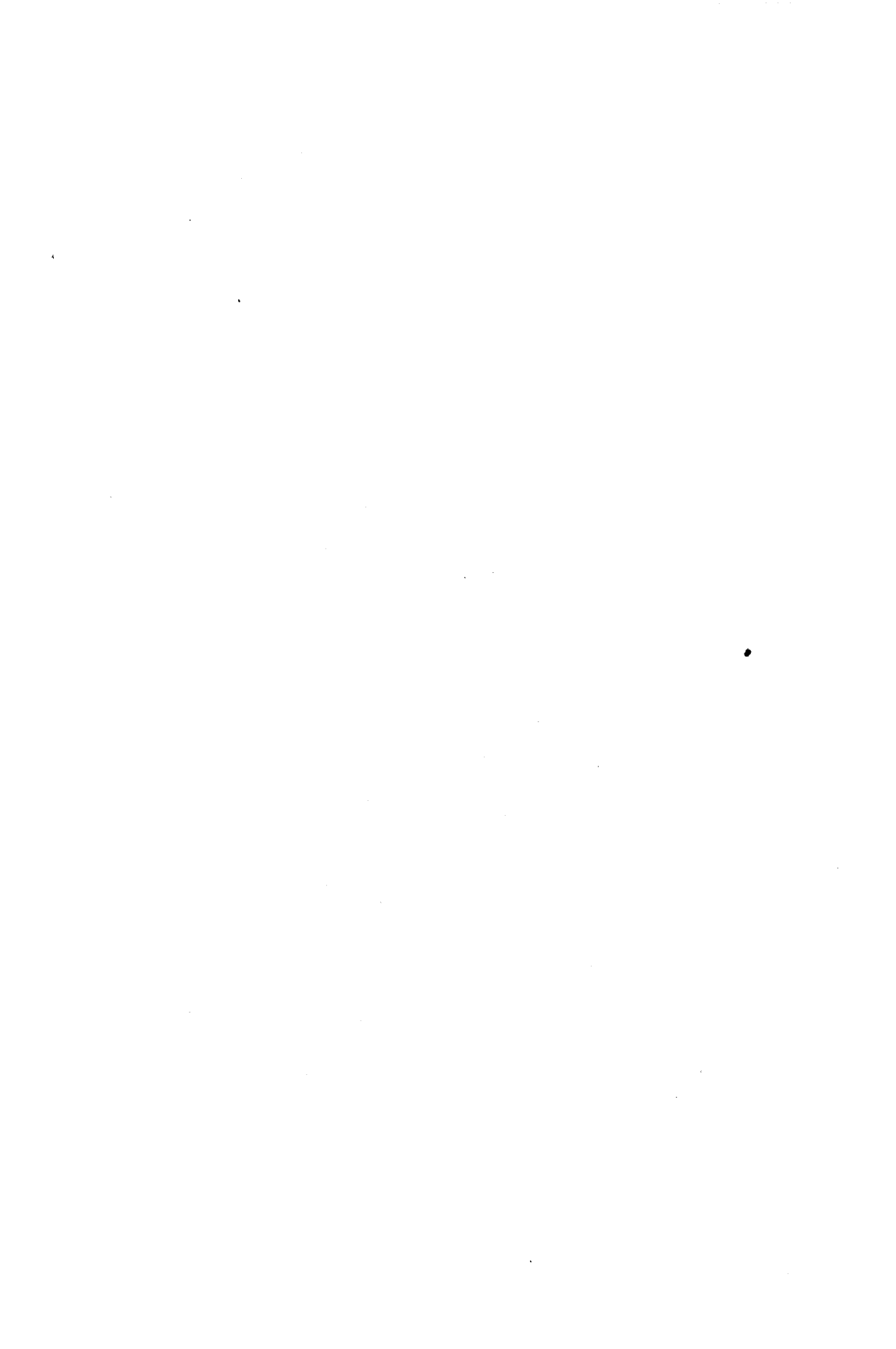
*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The town of Blue Hill in the county of Han-
2 cock, at any legal meeting of the voters thereof, may adopt
3 by-laws prohibiting the use of automobiles on the following
4 named sections of road within its limits, which having steep
5 grades and being narrow and circuitous are unsuitable and
6 dangerous for their use, to wit, from the Granite bridge near
7 Wescott's Corner, so called, easterly and southerly to

8 Friend's Corner, thence north-easterly to East Blue Hill
9 bridge, thence northerly to Inman's private way on Morgan's
10 Bay road, so called; also the road leading from Babson's
11 Corner, so called, northerly to Durgan's Corner, so called,
12 also the road leading from the Brooklin line northerly and
13 westerly to Falls bridge, also the road leading from Herrick's
14 Corner, so-called, north-easterly to Parker Point, so called,
15 thence north-westerly to Main street in Blue Hill village,
16 also the road leading from the corner near the Ball Place, so
17 called, south-westerly and westerly to the corner near the
18 Blue Hill Inn. Any section of road so closed shall be marked
19 at the entrance thereof by sign-boards in large letters, "No
20 Automobiles Allowed on this Road."

The term "automobile" as used in this section, applies to all
22 motor vehicles propelled by power. The town of Blue Hill
23 may vote at said meeting what punishment shall be inflicted
24 for the violation of such by-laws, but for the first offence,
25 not over twenty-five dollars and cost of prosecution, and for
26 the second offence, not over twenty-five dollars and thirty
27 days imprisonment, or both, and cost of prosecution.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
