STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to authorize the building of a bridge across Robbins' Bar, so called, between Deer Isle and Stinson's Neck, in the county of Hancock.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. A highway, town way or private way may be
2 laid out and constructed in the manner provided by chapter
3 twenty-three of the Revised Statutes, and thereafter altered
4 or widened, as provided by said chapter, in and over tide
5 waters across Robbins' bar, so called, between Deer Isle
6 proper and Stinson's Neck, in the town of Deer Isle, in the
7 county of Hancock.

Sect. 2. Subject to the provisions of the federal statutes,
2 the town of Deer Isle may construct and maintain a bridge
3 or causeway, with suitable approaches, in and over tide waters
4 across Robbins' bar, so called, between said Deer Isle proper
5 and said Stinson's Neck.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
