### STATE OF MAINE.

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section twenty-five of chapter nine of the Revised Statutes relating to taxation of property of manufacturing, mining and smelting corporations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section twenty-five of chapter nine of the 2 Revised Statutes is hereby amended by inserting after the 3 word manufactured in the sixth line thereof, the words 'and 4 the buildings and lands and other property of agricultural 5 and stock raising corporations shall be taxed to the corpora-6 tion, or to the person having possession of the property, in 7 the towns where the buildings and lands are situated and 8 where the personal property is kept,' so that said section, as 9 amended, shall read as follows:

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The buildings, lands and other property of man-'Sect. 25. 11 ufacturing, mining and smelting corporations, made personal 12 by their charters, and not exempt from taxation, and all stock 13 used in factories, shall be taxed to the corporations, or to the 14 persons having possession of their property or stock, in the 15 town or place where the corporations are established, or the 16 stock is manufactured; and the buildings and lands and 17 other property of agricultural and stock raising corporations 18 shall be taxed to the corporation, or to the person having 19 possession of the property, in the towns where the buildings 20 and lands are situated and where the personal property is 21 kept; and there shall be a lien for one year on such property 22 and stock for payment of such tax, and it may be sold for 23 payment thereof, as in other cases; and shares of the capital 24 stock of such corporations shall not be taxed to their owners."

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
