## STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE in favor of S. T. Kimball, secretary of the special joint committee on free transportation appointed by the 72nd Legislature.

Resolved, That there be and is hereby appropriated the sum 2 of one hundred forty-nine dollars and forty cents (\$149.40), 3 to be paid to S. T. Kimball, secretary of the special joint 4 committee on free transportation appointed by the 72nd 5 Legislature, this being the amount of the expenses actually 6 incurred by the committee in the discharge of its duties as 7 shown by the statement of facts and vouchers submitted 8 with this resolve.

## BRIEF STATEMENT OF FACTS

Accompanying Resolve in favor of S. T. Kimball, Secretary, to pay expenses of Joint Special Legislative Committee on Free Transportation appointed by the 72d Legislature.

A joint special committee to consider the matter of free transportation of public officials, consisting of two on the part of the Senate and three on the part of the House, was appointed by the 72d Legislature. This committee to serve without pay. The committee consisted of Senators Heselton of Kennebec, Sturgis of Cumberland on the part of the Senate; on the part of the House, Milliken of Island Falls, Kimball of Rockland, Hastings of Bethel. The first meeting of the committee was held at the Hallowell House, Hallowell, October 31, 1906. At that meeting it was voted that a public hearing should be given at the State House, Augusta, Thursday, November 15, 1906. This meeting was duly held. A final meeting of the committee was held November 30th at Augusta and Hallowell, at which time the report submitted to this Legislature was drawn. This resolve is for the purpose of reimbursing the members of the committee for expense actually incurred by them while performing the duty imposed by the Legislature appointing them.
