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## STATE OF MAINE.

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IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

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AN ACT to amend section 50, chapter 93 of the Revised  
Statutes of the State of Maine.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 50 of chapter 93 of the Revised Statutes is hereby  
2 amended by adding after the word "cordwood" in the second  
3 line 'or pulpwood or any wood used in the manufacture of  
4 pulp,' and by striking out that portion of the section after  
5 the word "attachment" in the sixth line, so that the section  
6 as amended shall read as follows:

'Sect. 50. Whoever labors at cutting, peeling or hauling  
8 hemlock bark or cutting, yarding or hauling cordwood or  
9 pulpwood or any wood used in the manufacture of pulp-  
10 wood, or at cooking for persons engaged in such labor, has

11 a lien thereon for the amount due for his personal service  
12 and the service performed by his team, which takes preced-  
13 ence of all other claims and continues for thirty days after  
14 the contract is completed and may be enforced by attach-  
15 ment.'
