IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Sunday river and tributaries
in the county of Oxford.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Sunday river, so called,
3 a stream in Riley plantation, in the county of Oxford, or in
4 any of its tributaries, except that it shall be lawful to fish
5 in said Sunday river below the mouth of Bull branch, so
6 called, to the main Androscoggin river from May 15th to
7 June 15th of each year in accordance with the general law
8 of the State.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more

3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further
4 fine of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or had
5 in possession in violation hereof.

Sect. 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take
2 effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game,
3 without expense to the state, shall have caused notices to be
4 posted in conspicuous places at or near said pond, setting
5 forth in substance the provisions of this act.
