^FRESOLVE in aid of the Temporary Home for Women and
Children at Portland.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated for the use of the Temporary Home
3 for Women and Children at Portland, of which two thou-
4 sand five hundred dollars shall be paid to said institution
5 during the year nineteen hundred and seven, and two thou-
6 sand five hundred dollars during the year nineteen hundred
7 and eight.

THE TEMPORARY HOME FOR WOMEN AND CHILDREN, PORTLAND, MAINE.

This Home is not a local charity, its work is for the whole State of Maine. Applicants from the most remote sections are received as readily and with precisely the same privileges as those from Portland.

Since the Home was established in 1882 over one thousand women and children from fifty different towns in this State have been sheltered there.

The Home was built and entirely supported for the first three years by private subscriptions. Since then it has received annual aid from the State, which partially defrays the expenses.
