

RESOLVE in aid of navigation on Lewey, Long and Big Lakes.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars 2 is hereby appropriated for placing and maintaining buoys 3 in Lewey, Long and Big lakes in Washington county.

All said money to be expended under the direction of the 5 state steamboat inspectors.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

A large number of passengers pass over these lakes each year in order to reach Grand Lake stream. A system of buoys should be maintained in order to keep the steamboats off the many rocks and shoals in the lakes.
