STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of Betsey Stover of Mt. Vernon.

Resolved, That there be paid to Betsey Stover, widow 2 of Albert Stover late of Mt. Vernon, County of Kennebec, 3 the sum of four dollars per month payable quarterly from 4 the fund appropriated for military purposes, to begin Jan'y 5 1st, 1907.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Betsey Stover widow of Albert Stover late of Mt. Vernon, Kennebec County, Maine.

Albert Stover died Dec. 9th, 1905, at the age of 86 years, 5 months, leaving his wife Betsey all alone, they having no relatives.

They lived on a small farm which produced but little, and had it not been for a state pension granted Mr. Stover for services in the Aroostook war they would have been obliged to have appealed to the town authorities for assistance.

Now that Mr. Stover is dead the widow has no means of support only the small income from two cows which is without question inadequate for a woman seventy-five years of age.

They have always been honest and upright citizens and it is very humiliating for her to think that she must become a town charge.
