IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Chapter 143 of the Revised Statutes relating to the Maine Industrial School for Girls.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I. Section thirty-one of chapter one hundred
2 forty-three of the Revised Statutes is hereby amended by
3 striking out all of said section after the word "proved" in
4 the fifth line, and inserting in place thereof the words 'the
5 expenses of clothing and subsistence of all girls committed
6 to said school shall be paid by the state at the same rate
7 as heretofore charged to the city or town of her residence

8 until otherwise provided for by additional appropriation for
9 the support of said school,' so that said section as amended
10 shall read as follows:

'Sect. 31. The court or justice by whom a girl is com-
12 mitted shall certify on the mittimus, her age, parentage,
13 birthplace, the charge on which she is committed, and the
14 city or town where she resided at the time of her arrest,
15 so far as he can ascertain such particulars; and this certifi-
16 cate shall be evidence of her true age until otherwise proved.
17 The expenses of clothing and subsistence of all girls com-
18 mitted to said school shall be paid by the state at the same
19 rate as heretofore charged to the city or town of her resi-
20 dence until otherwise provided for by additional appropri-
21 ation for the support of said school.'

Sect. 2. Section thirty-two of chapter one hundred forty-
2 three of the Revised Statutes is hereby repealed.

Sect. 3. This act shall take effect when approved.
