## STATE OF MAINE.

---

RESOLVE in favor of the town of St. Agatha in the county of Aroostook, to assist in building a road in said town.

---

*Resolved,* That the sum of four hundred dollars be and  
2 hereby is appropriated for the year nineteen hundred and  
3 seven, to aid in building a road in the town of St. Agatha.  
4 Provided that said town of St. Agatha furnishes, at least,  
5 five hundred dollars of its own money towards building said  
6 road, the same to be expended under the direction of an agent  
7 appointed by the Governor and Council. Said amount to be  
8 paid upon certificate of said agent to the Governor and Coun-  
9 cil that the road is completed and that the town of St. Agatha  
10 has expended at least five hundred dollars of its own money  
11 towards building said road.



### STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This road is to open a market to about two hundred people and connect them with the highway road running from St. Agatha and Frenchville. It runs in a westerly direction for a distance of a little over two miles, crossing several lots now occupied by settlers, all of whom are asking a reasonable compensation for what land will be taken to build said road.

The town will also have to build a bridge at a cost of about two hundred dollars, and the best estimate made by conservative men of that place shows that the bridge and grading and the amount paid for the land will cost at least one thousand dollars.

If the State furnishes four hundred dollars, the town will agree to furnish the balance to complete the road.
