RESOLVE in favor of St. Francis Plantation to repair river road across Reuben Bran's homestead farm which was washed out by freshet.

Resolved, That there be appropriated the sum of eight

- 2 hundred dollars to repair the main traveled highway in St.
- 3 Francis Plantation running across Reuben Bran's homestead
- 4 farm along the bank of the St. John river, which part of said
- 5 road on said Bran's farm was caved in and washed out by
- 6 the water from said river during the spring freshet of 1906.
- 7 Said amount to be expended under the direction of the State
- 8 Highway Commissioner.
