STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in the tributaries to Chemo Pond,
in the County of Penobscot.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in any of the tributaries to
3 Chemo pond, in the county of Penobscot, for a distance of
4 one mile up the stream from the mouth of each tributary.
5 Provided that, without expense to the State, the mile point
6 on each stream shall be plainly marked with a proper notice.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this
2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars
3 nor more than thirty dollars for each offense and a further
4 penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed or
5 had in possession in violation of the provisions of this act.
