## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Big and Little Indian ponds and tributaries, in the County of Somerset.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
  - 2 kill any trout or landlocked salmon at any time in Big Indian
  - 3 or Little Indian ponds or their tributaries, in the town of
  - 4 St. Albans, for a period of two years.
  - Sect. 2. It shall be unlawful to fish through the ice for
  - 2 any kind of fish, for a period of four years, in either of said
- 3 ponds, except on Wednesday of each week, between daylight
- 4 and dark.
  - Sect. 3. It shall be unlawful for one family to take, catch
- 2 or have in possession more than fifteen pounds of pickerel
- 3 taken in one day in ice fishing in these ponds.

- Sect. 4. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this 2 act shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten nor more 3 than thirty dollars and costs for each offense and a further 4 penalty of one dollar for each fish taken, caught, killed, or 5 had in possession in violation hereof.
- Sect. 5. Provided, further, that this act shall not take 2 effect until the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game, 3 without expense to the State, have caused notices to be 4 posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein 5 described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.
