IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

---

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Bartlett's and Crook's brook,  
so called, in the County of York.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or  
2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Bartlett's and Cook's  
3 brook, so called, from and beginning at its source, the outlet  
4 of Bartlett pond, situated in the towns of Lyman and Water-  
5 boro, and all its tributaries, to and as far as C. F. Clark  
6 and Son's mill pond, for a period of three years.

Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act  
2 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor

3 more than thirty dollars and a further penalty of one dollar  
4 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in  
5 violation of this act.

Sect. 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take  
2 effect until the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game,  
3 without expense to the State, have caused notices to be  
4 posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein  
5 described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.
