IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing in Bartlett's and Crook's brook, so called, in the County of York.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

- Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish for, take, catch or
- 2 kill any kind of fish at any time in Bartlett's and Cook's
- 3 brook, so called, from and beginning at its source, the outlet
- 4 of Bartlett pond, situated in the towns of Lyman and Water-
- 5 boro, and all its tributaries, to and as far as C. F. Clark
- 6 and Son's mill pond, for a period of three years.
- Sect. 2. Whoever violates any of the provisions of this act
- 2 shall be subject to a penalty of not less than ten dollars nor

- 3 more than thirty dollars and a further penalty of one dollar
- 4 for each fish taken, caught, killed or had in possession in
- 5 violation of this act.
- Sect. 3. Provided, further, that this act shall not take
- 2 effect until the Commissioners of Inland Fisheries and Game,
- 3 without expense to the State, have caused notices to be
- 4 posted in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein
- 5 described setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.
