STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to regulate fishing through the ice in South East pond, in Baldwin and Sebago, in the county of Cumberland, and in Barker pond and Middle pond, both situated partly in Sebago, in said county of Cumberland, and partly in Hiram, in the county of Oxford.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to fish through the ice for 2 any kind of fish in South East pond, in Baldwin and Sebago, 3 in the county of Cumberland, or Barker pond or Middle 4 pond, both situated partly in Sebago, in said county of Cum-5 berland, and partly in Hiram, in the county of Oxford, 6 except during February, March and April of each year,

- 7 during which time it shall be lawful to fish as provided in 8 the general law of the state.
- Sect. 2. Provided, further, that this act shall not take 2 effect until the commissioners of inland fisheries and game,
- 3 without expense to the state, have caused notices to be posted
- 4 in conspicuous places at or near the waters herein described
- 5 setting forth in substance the provisions of this act.
