STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, in favor of a Maine Soldier's Monument at the national cemetery at Salisbury, North Carolina.

Resolved, That the sum of five thousand dollars be and is 2 hereby appropriated to be expended during the year one 3 thousand nine hundred and six for the purpose of erecting 4 a monument in the national cemetery at Salisbury, North 5 Carolina, to perpetuate the memory of our patriotic Maine 6 soldiers who gave their lives while confined therein as pris-7 oners of war. The appropriation called for in this resolve 8 shall be expended for the purpose named, under the direcguion and at the discretion of a commission to consist of the 10 governor of the state of Maine and two other members, one 11 of whom, at least, shall have been a prisoner of war at said 12 Salisbury, said two commissioners to be appointed by the

13 governor within two months after the passage of this resolve.

14 The reasonable expenses of said commission shall be allowed

15 and paid out of the appropriation made by this resolve, and

16 they shall complete their work and make their report thereon

17 to the governor and council on or before the last day of

18 December one thousand nine hundred and six.
