RESOLVE in favor of the town of Liberty for money paid out
on account of State Roads.

Resolved, That the sum of one hundred and ten dollars be
2 and hereby is appropriated to be paid to the town of Liberty
3 for the purpose of reimbursing said town for money paid
4 out on account of state roads during the year 1903 under
5 the provisions of chapter 23, R. S.



STATEMENT OF FACTS.

Said town respectfully represents that in the year 1903 there was expended in the town of Liberty for state roads the sum of four hundred and twenty dollars and that said town has only received one hundred dollars from the state, therefore, under chapter 23, R. S., said town is entitled to receive from the state one hundred and ten dollars additional.
