STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT authorizing the agent of the Passamaquoddy tribe of
Indians to remove any of the distressed poor of that tribe to
either reservation within his agency limits.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows :*

Section 1. Any member of the Passamaquoddy tribe of
2 Indians, requiring assistance under the provisions of chapter
3 thirteen, section forty-three of the Revised Statutes, relating
4 to aid to the distressed poor of said tribe, may be removed
5 by the state agent for said tribe from any place in which he
6 may be residing, or be found, to either of the Indian reserva-
7 tions provided for said tribe, or may be removed from one
8 of such reservations to another such reservation, whenever,
9 in the judgment of such agent, such removal should be made.

Sect. 2. This act shall take effect when approved.
