IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE  
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to authorize Penobscot River Railroad Company to  
locate across Lake Megunticook and other waters.

---

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section 1. The Penobscot River Railroad Company, a cor-  
2 poration organized under the general law is hereby author-  
3 ized and empowered to locate its railroad across and through  
4 Lake Megunticook in the towns of Camden and Lincolnville,  
5 in the counties of Knox and Waldo, and across and over the  
6 islands therein, where such location may be found necessary  
7 and convenient; and across such other great ponds and navi-  
8 gable and public waters as may be within the line of its road

9 as generally located in its charter, or hereafter specifically  
10 located. But not unnecessarily to impede or interfere with  
11 the right of flowage, acquired by purchase or under the “Mill  
12 Act”; and damage occasioned by a violation of this clause,  
13 may be recovered in an action in the case.

Sect. 2. The Board of Railroad Commissioners shall have  
2 the same control, and supervision over the location of said  
3 Railroad Company herein authorized, as they have by the  
4 general law, over the remainder of the location of the rail-  
5 road of said Railroad Company.

Sect. 3. This Act shall take effect, when approved.
