STATE OF MAINE.

RESOLVE, making appropriation for the Penobscot Tribe
of Indians.

Resolved: That there be paid from the State treasury, to
2 be expended under the direction of the Governor and Council,
3 to the Agent of the Penobscot tribe of Indians, for the bene-
4 fit of said tribe for the years nineteen hundred and seven and
5 nineteen hundred and eight, as follows:

Interest on tribe's fund each year, forty-four hundred
7 twenty-nine dollars and seventy cents; agricultural purposes,
8 each year, eight hundred fifty dollars; annuity, each year,
9 seventeen hundred dollars; bounty on crops, each year, two
10 hundred dollars; salary of teachers, each year, one thousand

11 dollars; incidental expenses for the schools, each year, four
12 hundred dollars; repairs to be made on schoolhouse, one
13 hundred fifty dollars; repairs made on Roman Catholic
14 church, two hundred dollars; salary, each year, of agent of
15 tribe, four hundred dollars; salary of governor of tribe, each
16 year, one hundred dollars; salary of lieutenant governor, each
17 year, fifty dollars; constable for police purposes, each year,
18 one hundred dollars; Roman Catholic priest, each year, one
19 hundred twenty-five dollars; superintendent of farming, each
20 year, fifty dollars; for medicine and medical attendance upon
21 the members of said tribe, each year, one thousand dollars to
22 be deducted from shore rentals; for shore rentals each year,
23 thirty-four hundred thirty-four dollars, and that fifteen per
24 cent of said shore rentals be appropriated and allowed for the
25 use of municipal purposes.
