IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section eight of chapter twenty of the Revised Statutes of nineteen hundred three, relating to burying grounds.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section 1. Section eight of chapter twenty of the Revised

- 2 Statutes of nineteen hundred three is hereby amended by
- 3 adding after the words "dwelling house" in the sixth line
- 4 thereof the words 'or well from which the water is used for
- 5 domestic purposes;' and after the words "dwelling house"
- 6 in the eleventh line thereof the words 'or well;' and after
- 7 the words "dwelling house" in the fifteenth line thereof the
- 8 words 'or well,' so that said section as amended shall read as
- o follows:

The municipal officers of any town, may on peti-II tion of ten voters, enlarge any public cemetery or burying 12 ground or incorporated cemetery or burying ground within 13 their town by taking land of adjacent owners, to be paid for 14 by the town or otherwise as the municipal officers may direct, 15 when in their judgment public necessity requires it, provided, 16 that the limits thereof shall not be extended nearer any 17 dwelling house or well from which the water is used for 18 domestic purposes within twenty-five rods, against the writ-19 ten protest of the owner, made to said officers at the time of 20 hearing on said petition. Nor shall any person, corporation 21 or association establish, locate or enlarge any cemetery or 22 burying ground by selling or otherwise disposing of land, 23 so that the limits thereof shall be extended nearer any dwell-24 ing house or well within twenty-five rods, against the writ-25 ten protest of the owner, provided, that nothing in this sec-26 tion shall prohibit the sale or disposition of lots within the 27 limits of any existing cemetery or burying ground, nor the 28 extension thereof away from any dwelling house or well.'
