STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend chapter sixty-four of the Private and Special Laws of eighteen hundred and ninety-nine, as amended by chapter four hundred and seventy-two of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and one, and by chapter forty-eight of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and three, and by chapter two hundred and five of the Private and Special Laws of nineteen hundred and five, relating to the Wilson Stream Dam Company.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section three of said act is hereby amended by striking out 2 all the words after the word "toll" in the second line to the 3 word "and" at the commencement of the sixth line, and

4 insert in lieu thereof the words 'for the passage of all logs 5 driven over its said dams and improvements and landed 6 above the present south line of the town of Greenville, of 7 twenty-five cents for each thousand feet, board measure, 8 woods scale, and of ten cents per cord for each cord of 9 spruce, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock and poplar, which is cut four 10 feet and under in length, and for the passage of all logs, II landed below the present south line of the town of Green-12 ville, and above Tobey Falls, of fifteen cents for each thou-13 sand feet, board measure, woods scale, and for all logs landed 14 below said Tobey Falls and driven into Sebec lake of five 15 cents for each thousand feet, board measure, woods scale, 16 and for each cord of spruce, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock and 17 poplar, which is cut four feet and under in length, landed 18 below the present south line of the town of Greenville and 19 the mouth of Davis stream, of five cents per cord, and for 20 each cord of spruce, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock, and poplar, 21 which is cut four feet and under in length, driven out of said 22 Davis stream and landed below the mouth of said Davis 23 stream, two cents per cord, each operator shall send to the 24 office of said Wilson Stream Dam Company or its succes-25 sors, in Greenville, Maine, on or before May one of each 26 year, a true copy of the scale bills of said operator, with 27 signature of the scaler thereon and showing the whole num-28 ber of thousands or cords for which said operator is to pay 29 tolls;' and after the word "logs" in the sixth line, insert the 30 words 'and lumber aforesaid,' and after the word "logs" in 31 the eighth line insert the words 'and lumber;' and after the

32 word "logs" in the tenth line insert the words 'and lumber;'
33 and after the word "logs" in the twelfth line insert the words
34 'and lumber;' so that said section when amended shall read
35 as follows:

'Sect. 3. The said corporation may demand and receive a 37 toll for the passage of all logs driven over its said dams and 38 improvements and landed above the present south line of the 39 town of Greenville, of twenty-five cents for each thousand 40 feet, board measure, woods scale, and of ten cents per cord 41 for each cord of spruce, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock, and poplar, 42 which is cut four feet and under in length, and for the pas-43 sage of all logs landed below the present south line of the 44 town of Greenville and above Tobey Falls, of fifteen cents 45 for each thousand feet board measure, woods scale, and for 46 all logs landed below said Tobey Falls and driven into Sebec 47 lake of five cents for each thousand feet, board measure, 48 woods scale, and for each cord of spruce, pine, fir, cedar, 49 hemlock, and poplar, which is cut four feet and under in 50 length, landed below the present south line of the town of 51 Greenville, and the mouth of Davis stream, of five cents per 52 cord, and for each cord of spruce, pine, fir, cedar, hemlock, 53 and poplar, which is cut four feet and under in length 54 driven out of said Davis stream and landed below the mouth 55 of said Davis stream, two cents per cord, each operator shall 56 send to the office of said Wilson stream dam company or its 57 successors in Greenville, Maine, on or before May one of 58 each year, a true copy of the scale bills of said operator with 59 the signature of the scaler thereon, and showing the whole

60 number of thousands or cords for which said operator is to 61 pay tolls, and said corporation shall have a lien upon all 62 logs and lumber aforesaid which may pass over any if its 63 dams and improvements for the payment of said tolls, but 64 the logs and lumber of each particular mark shall be holden 65 only for the tolls of such mark, and unless such toll is paid 66 within twenty days after such logs and lumber, or a major 67 part of them shall arrive at the Penobscot boom, or place 68 of manufacture, said corporation may seize said logs and 69 lumber and sell at public auction so many thereof as shall be 70 necessary to pay such toll, and costs and charges, notice of 71 the time and place of such sale, ten days before such sale, 72 being first given in newspapers printed at Bangor, and 73 Dover, and when said corporation shall from tolls be reim-74 bursed for its expenditures and eight per cent interest there-75 on, the toll shall cease.'
