## STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend Section I of Chapter 75 of the Revised Statutes in relation to the ownership of down timber and bark.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Legislature assembled, as follows:

Section I of Chapter 75 of the Revised Statutes is hereby 2 amended by striking out all of the words in said section 3 after the word "deed" in the fifth line and before the word 4 "and" in the sixth line, and inserting in place thereof the 5 words 'but such down trees as are cut into wood, logs or 6 other lumber, and hemlock bark peeled are personal prop-7 erty,' so that said section as amended will read as follows: 'Section I. A person owning real estate and having a

o right of entry into it, whether seized of it or not, may con-

10 vey it or all his interest in it, by a deed to be acknowledged
11 and recorded as hereinafter provided. Down trees lying on
12 land at the time of conveyance, are real estate and pass by
13 the deed; but such down trees as are cut into wood, logs
14 or other lumber, and hemlock bark peeled are personal prop15 erty, and the owner may remove them in a reasonable
16 time thereafter. Carpets and carpeting, stoves and funnels
17 belonging thereto, are not real estate and do not pass by a
18 deed thereof.'
