STATE OF MAINE.

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD ONE THOUSAND NINE
HUNDRED AND SEVEN.

AN ACT to amend section forty-four of chapter forty of the
Revised Statutes, relating to sanitary conditions of factories,
workshops, mines and quarries.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
Legislature assembled, as follows:*

Section forty-four of chapter forty of the Revised Statutes
2 of nineteen hundred three is hereby amended by striking out
3 the words "the local board of health, and said board of health
4 shall investigate the matter" in the last two lines of said
5 section, and substituting in place thereof the words: 'and
6 direct the employer to rectify the same; and if said employer

7 shall neglect or refuse so to do within a reasonable time,
8 said inspector may cause the same to be done at the expense
9 of the employer,' so that said section as amended shall read
10 as follows:

‘Sect. 44. The said inspector, upon complaint, shall inquire
12 into, and prosecute for, any violations of sections fifty-seven
13 and fifty-eight of this chapter, relating to the fortnightly pay-
14 ment of wages. He shall also examine into the sanitary
15 condition of factories, workshops, mines and quarries, and
16 when any condition or thing is found that, in his opinion
17 endangers the health or lives of the employees, he shall notify
18 and direct the employer to rectify the same; and if said
19 employer shall neglect or refuse so to do within a reasonable
20 time, said inspector may cause the same to be done at the
21 expense of the employer.’”
