RESOLVE in favor of the town of Howland for the purpose of
repairing bridge across the Piscataquis river.

Resolved, That the sum of eleven hundred dollars be and
2 hereby is appropriated for and in behalf of the town of How-
3 land to be expended under the direction of the road commis-
4 sioners of said town for the purpose of repairing the bridge
5 across the Piscataquis river in said town.

STATEMENT OF FACTS.

This bridge across the Piscataquis river near the mouth of the Piscataquis river, is 530 feet long, a public thoroughfare for all adjoining towns to cross, and is very much out of repair, will have to be planked this year at a cost of five hundred and seventy-five dollars, and extensive repairs on its piers will have to be done this year, probably at a cost of one thousand dollars, and this is a great burden for a small town of only ninety-seven property holders.
